

# **Course Navigation**

## Settings

The suggested web browsers for viewing this course are Chrome, Firefox and Safari. The minimum suggested computer screen resolution in 1024 x 768.

### Requirements

This course includes a series of 14 self-paced, computer modules that are available on USB memory sticks. A new set of modules will be distributed to you prior to each of the upcoming workshops. You are required to complete the assigned modules independently prior to attending the workshops. At each workshop, you will be tested on the material covered within the modules and you will be asked to apply the information that you learned to a variety of interactive activities designed to build your professional skills.

### Opening the Module

1. Insert the USB memory stick into the USB port on your computer.



2. Open the file containing the module.

If you are using a PC computer:

Go to "My Computer" and double click on the volume named "SPS\_COURSE".

If you are using a Mac computer:

The USB drive will appear as a volume on your desktop with the name "SPS\_COURSE".

- Double click the volume icon to open it.
- Double click on "Start\_Course.html".



3. The Module will open in a browser window on your computer.



#### Navigating the Modules

Before beginning the module, take a minute to become familiar with the course navigation features outlined below.

1. Lessons: The Modules are presented as a series of lessons. To start a lesson, click the Lessons tab located on the main navigation bar. This will open a drop-down menu listing all of the lessons included within the Module. Select a lesson from the menu by clicking a lesson title.



2. Topics: Once a lesson has been selected, a Topics tab will appear on the main navigation bar. To open a topic, click the Topics tab on the main navigation bar, and then click a topic title on the drop-down menu.



3. Page shortcuts: When you reach the end of a topic, you will see a 'click here' link located at the bottom of the page. Click this link to advance directly to the next page of the Module. This shortcut allows you to bypass the main navigation and advance through the module in chronological sequence.

	Topic Summary
	International trade produces many benefits, but there are also challenges. When countries try to protect domestic markets, those actions can negatively affect international relations and economic stability. After World War II, the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) was created to promote market stability by liberalizing trade. The GATT functioned successfully for several decades until the World Trade Organization (WTO) replaced it. The WTO was better able to address the needs and challenges associated with international trade and market liberalization.
